

Cutting Back Perennials

Some perennials will benefit from being cut back. For these, such a process will encourage the plant to produce more flowers. Once the initial display of flowering has ended, cut back the entire plant by two-thirds, leaving one-third of the plant. Fertilize with **Bordine Nursery Better Blooms™ Perennial Fertilizer** and water to promote new growth. You'll be rewarded with another dazzling display of flowers in just a few weeks.
